Saturday, May 14th 8:30 am – 10:00 am

Appliance Maintenance (Fridge & Stove) – Don Lynn, Go RV, Red Deer

Do you question how your fridge and stove operate and wonder how to trouble shoot problems? This session will help you learn the components and operation of these appliances for their safe operation.

Your Poo & You (Water Systems) – Stephen Hockridge, SAIT Instructor – NEW INSTRUCTOR

There is a free zone, which only requires an FM3 visa and vehicle insurance. There are many beautiful beaches with RV parks, small towns cities and restaurants. The majority of Sonora and further south in Mexico, requires you to obtain a vehicle permit and this will be explained. Wendee will tell you about places they have been and what they love about the country, the people and of course some of the places they have stayed, for a week or two, or 4 or 5 months. Wendee will share what amenities and site seeing spots to do before crossing over. It is one of those trips anyone retired (or not) should look at doing.
